Support Services

We work with the young women to develop essential life and living skills that enables a pathway to transition to independent living.

Comprehensive Support Services:

- **Life Skills Development:** Connection with education, training and employment and engaging with community.
- **Living Skills Development:** Cooking, cleaning, budgeting, and acquiring other practical skills.
- **Culturally Appropriate Services:** Respecting the diversity of cultures. The service is inclusive and sensitive to different cultural practices, beliefs, and preferences.
- **Personalised Support:** Referrals to specialised services. Our goal is to ensure that everyone receives the specific support they need.
- **Affordable Board Fee:** A weekly board fee of \$100* is charged. For those with an income, this fee covers all related expenses, including food, electricity, and internet.
